ANNUAL APPROPRIATION RESOLUTION.

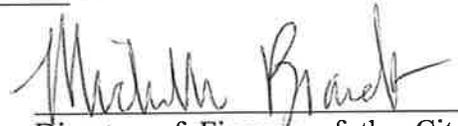

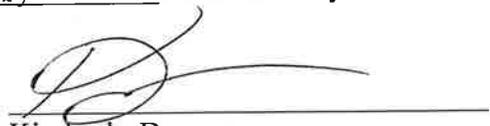

SECTION 19.

Due to an unforeseen loss in revenue caused by businesses leaving the city and the continuation of the national Coronavirus Pandemic, it is estimated that the City will end 2023 with a balance well below that required in the City’s General Fund Carryover Balance Policy. Based on the policy the City, should carry forward a minimum of six month of the previous years’ operating expenses, which is equal to \$1,155,921. Based on the estimated Ending Fund Balance for 2023 the City will only carry over \$579,200. Through the new developments, new business prospects, and continued reduction of expenditures the City hopes to be in compliance by December 2024.

SECTION 20.

This Resolution shall take effect immediately after passage of this Resolution as provided in 4.07(A)(1) of the Charter of the City of Brookville, Ohio.

And the Director of Finance is hereby authorized to draw warrants on the City Treasury for payments from any of the foregoing appropriations upon receiving proper certificates and vouchers therefore, approved by the board or officers authorized by law to approve the same, or an ordinance or resolution of council to make the expenditures; provided that no warrants shall be drawn or paid for salaries or wages except to persons employed by authority of and in accordance with law or Ordinance. Provided further that the appropriations for contingencies can only be expended upon appeal or two-thirds vote of Council for items of expense constituting a legal obligation against the city, and for purposes other than those covered by other specific appropriations herein made.
