Youth-In-Government Council Member Sarah O'Neal requested a speed limit sign be placed on both sides of Albert Road between Brookville-Salem Road and Upper Lewisburg-Salem Road. Member O'Neal stated the speed limit on Brookville Phillipsburg Road going south is 55 mph. The speed limit does not change until you get to Brookhaven, and then it becomes 25 mph. On Albert Road, just before Brookhaven going north, the speed limit sign posted is 25 mph. There is not another speed limit sign until you cross Upper Lewisburg-Salem Road and then it becomes 55 mph.

Youth-In-Government Police Chief Jaime Mitrisin stated she will consult with the City Manager on this issue.
