

BROOKVILLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL
SPECIAL MEETING
“YOUTH-IN-GOVERNMENT”

The Special Meeting of the Brookville Municipal Council was called to order by Mayor Dafler at 7:30 P.M. on June 1, 2000 in the Brookville High School Auditorium.

Mayor Dafler welcomed everyone and gave a brief presentation of the “Youth-In-Government” program, stating that this is the 25th year. Mayor Dafler introduced the “Youth-In-Government Officials” and presented them with “Certificates of Merit” for their participation in this program, as they assumed their positions from the regular officials.

Members Duncan, Garber, Imler, Seagraves, Shellabarger and Trimble; Manager Wright, Assistant Manager Sewert, Law Director Stephan, Fire Chief Nickel and Police Sergeant Preston were present.


Motion by Seagraves, seconded by Imler to accept the Agenda as presented. All yeas, motion carried.

Motion by Imler, seconded by Duncan to accept the May 16, 2000 Regular Meeting Minutes as presented. All yeas, motion carried.

Reports were give by the various “Youth-In-Government Officials” with no additions to the reports by the regular officials and no action taken.

The “Youth-In-Government” Council asked the regular Council to look into and consider painting the curbs on the east side of Maple Street yellow, where parking of vehicles is not permitted; preparing an Ordinance to require the bars in town to keep their doors closed during their business hours; and request that the pot holes in the alley that runs along the side of the high school be filled. Youth-In-Government Mayor Brunner advised that the Manager will research the request for Maple Street and the alley, and the Law Director will review the Ordinance request.
