SPECIAL MEETING
“YOUTH-IN-GOVERNMENT”
BROOKVILLE HIGH SCHOOL AUDITORIUM
May 29, 2003

The Special Meeting of the Brookville City Council was called to order by Mayor Imler at 7:30 p.m. on May 29, 2003 in the Brookville High School Auditorium. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Mayor Imler welcomed everyone in attendance for the “Youth-In-Government” Special Council Meeting.

Mayor Imler administered the Oath of Office to Firefighter/EMT Kyle Ullery and Douglas McKee, and Police Officer Gregory Lightcap.

Mayor Imler introduced Manager Wright who commented that this year’s “Youth-In-Government” participants had a very successful year. Manager Wright thanked the Brookville School Board, Administrative Staff, Mr. Brown, “Youth-In-Government” students, Department Heads and City employees.

Each Council Member and Department Director introduced their respective representative and presented them with a Certificate of Merit for their participation, as they assumed their positions from the regular officials.

Members Duncan, Garber, Sanders, Seagraves, Trimble and Ullery; Manager Wright, Assistant Manager Sewert, Law Director Stephan, Police Chief Preston and Assistant Fire Chief Jackson were present. Fire Chief Nickel was absent.

Motion by Duncan, second by Seagraves to accept the Agenda as presented. All yeas, motion carried.

Motion by Seagraves, second by Duncan to accept the May 20, 2003 Regular Meeting Minutes as presented. All yeas, motion carried.

Citizens Comments: Mark Brown, Brookville High School Government Teacher, gave a brief overview of the “Youth-In-Government” program. Mr. Brown commented, compared to the last eight years, this senior class had the most students run for Council positions.

The “Youth-In-Government” Finance Director/Clerk Honnold gave her report with no action taken.

The “Youth-In-Government” Mayor gave his report with no action taken.

Motion by Duncan, second by Seagraves to read proposed Resolution No. 03-14. All yeas, motion carried.

Motion by Duncan, second by Sanders to accept the second reading of proposed Resolution No. 03-14. All yeas, motion carried.

The "Youth-In-Government" Council asked the regular Council to consider the following requests:


- Implement a summer internship program for students who are interested in government.
