Master of Ceremonies, Jessica Sunschein, welcomed everyone to the last public activity for this year's Seniors. Ms. Sunschein thanked the City of Brookville, Clay and Perry Townships, Brookville Local Schools and the Class of 2004 for making this “Youth-In-Government” activity possible. Ms. Sunschein commented on the selection process that was held for the “Youth-In-Government” Mayor and Council, Department Heads and the work schedule.

The Special Meeting of the Brookville City Council was called to order by Mayor Seagraves at 7:35 p.m. on June 3, 2004 in the Brookville High School Auditorium.

Mayor Seagraves welcomed everyone in attendance for the “Youth-In-Government” Special Council Meeting, and stated this is the 28th Annual “Youth-In-Government” Council Meeting. Brookville High School Principal, Tim Hopkins, Brookville Schools Superintendent, and Brookville School Board Members.

The “Youth-In-Government” Assistant Manager Thrush gave his report with no action taken.

The “Youth-In-Government” Fire Chief Steffey gave her report with no action taken.

The “Youth-In-Government” Police Chief McNew gave his report with no action taken.

The “Youth-In-Government” Law Director Bennett gave her report with no action taken.

Motion by Reel, second by Duncan to accept the third reading and adopt Ordinance No. 2004-03 entitled “AN ORDINANCE ZONING CERTAIN LOTS OF THE REVISED CONSECUTIVE NUMBER OF LOTS OF THE CITY OF BROOKVILLE, OHIO TO A NEW CLASSIFICATION.” All yeas, motion carried.



Motion by Duncan, second by Ullery to read proposed Resolution No. 04-14. All yeas, motion carried.


Motion by Ullery, second Hanos to accept the first reading, dispense with the second and third reading and adopt Resolution No. 04-14 entitled "A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE NECESSITY OF CONSTRUCTING, REPLACING OR REPAIRING CERTAIN SIDEWALKS, CURBS AND GUTTERS IN THE CITY OF BROOKVILLE, OHIO, AND DECLARING IT AN EMERGENCY." Reel yea, Duncan yea, Seagraves abstains, Hanos yea and Ullery yea. Motion carried with four yeas and one abstention.

The "Youth-In-Government" students presented suggestions during New Business. Assistant Manager Thrush asked the City of Brookville to establish a rule that would require a contractor to register with the City before starting any work in the City. This will assure that contractor's have the proper liability insurance and Workers' Compensation insurance, and it would eliminate fraud. Council Member McDaniel asked the Brookville School Board if they could decide on a name for the new street soon. Member McDaniel commented that she would like to see sidewalks that lead to the new school.
