SPECIAL MEETING

Member Garber arrived.


Dick Bernstein, representing the Miller-Valentine Group, gave a brief presentation on the proposed 72-unit apartment development to be located at the dead end of Calmer Ernst Blvd. Mr. Bernstein indicated the land is currently zoned R-3, multi-family, and has been for some time. Mr. Bernstein commented that the Miller-Valentine Group was seeking Council support through a Resolution. Mr. Bernstein went on to explain the financing mechanism involved with this development. Mr. Bernstein commented that the application process would continue without Council's support; they may score fewer points without it.

A question and answer session was held with Council Members and representatives of the Miller-Valentine Group.

Mayor Seagraves opened the floor, for a question and answer session, for the numerous citizens and township residents that were present.
