SEPTEMBER 4, 1984

The regular meeting of the Brookville Municipal Council was called to order by Mayor Brown at 7:30 P.M. on September 4, 1984 in the Municipal Council Chambers. Members Apgar, Imler, Keener, Seagraves and Weaver; Manager Wright, Law Director Zuhl and Police Director Rose were present. Member Ausra was absent.

Motion by Apgar, seconded by Imler to accept the agenda as presented. All yeas, motion carried.

Motion by Imler, seconded by Apgar to approve the August 21, 1984 regular meeting minutes as presented. All yeas, motion carried.

Manager Wright gave his report with the following action taken:

Motion by Imler, seconded by Apgar to authorize the Manager to enter into a contract with the Humane Society of Montgomery County for accepting and disposing of stray cats acquired by the Municipality at a fee of ten dollars (\$10.00) per cat. Apgar, Imler, Keener, Seagraves and Brown yeas; Weaver nays, motion carried with 5 yeas and 1 nay.

Manager Wright read various letters commending Brookville Police, also Ron Brandt, and reported on several items of Municipal personnel doing outstanding jobs in hectic situations the past two or three weeks.

Mayor Brown gave his report with the following action taken:

Chief Rose presented a Certificate of Appreciation to Rod Fryman for the recovery of money he found from the bank holdup.

Mayor Brown presented Mayor's Community Service Award to Rod Fryman for recovery of the bank holdup money.

Mayor Brown presented Mayor's Community Service Award to Wayne Watkins for long and outstanding work with the Brookville Historical Society and preserving the history of Brookville.

Announced that there would be a Work Session following Council meeting.

Mayor Brown read a Proclamation to proclaim September 22, 1984 as American Business Women's Day.

Motion by Apgar, seconded by Imler to authorize blocking of Mulberry Street between Market Street and alley north of Market on October 20, 1984 in the A.M. for a concert by the Brookville Marching Band. All yeas, motion carried.

Motion by Imler, seconded by Apgar to adjourn. All yeas, motion carried.
