The regular meeting of the Brookville Municipal Council was called to order by Mayor Apgar at 7:35 P.M. on September 7, 1982 in the Municipal Council Chambers. Members Ausra, Brown, Imler, Keener and Weaver and Manager Wright were present. Member Dean, Law Director Zuhl and Clerk-Finance Director Roeser were absent.

Motion by Imler, seconded by Weaver to approve the August 17, 1982 regular meeting minutes as presented. All yeas, motion carried.

Mayor Apgar thanked Vice Mayor Brown for conducting the last meeting.

Citizens Comments: A Main Street resident wants to know if next year drinking will be permitted again on his street during the Community Picnic and discussion followed.

Manager Wright gave his report with the following action taken.

Motion by Imler, seconded by Weaver to accept the low bid of \$21.15 per ton of asphalt for street resurfacing from The Republic Asphalt Paving Co. All yeas, motion carried.

Ptl. Patrick H. Matlock was released from probation as of today.

The Fire Dept.'s Go-Cart Race will be held on Sunday, September 19, 1982 at 1:00 P.M. Discussion followed and Council requested they do not start warm-up time until 12:00 Noon.

Motion by Keener, seconded by Imler to authorize the Manager to enter into a contract with the Montgomery County Community Development for funding (\$70,000.) of the Senior Citizens Group Park Grant. All yeas, motion carried.

Mayor Apgar gave his report with no action taken.

Motion by Weaver, seconded by Brown to read proposed Ordinance #1982-12. Ausra and Imler nay; Apgar, Brown, Keener and Weaver yea, motion carried with 4 yeas and 2 nays.

Motion by Weaver, seconded by Brown to accept the first reading of proposed Ordinance #1982-12. Ausra and Imler nay; Apgar, Brown, Keener and Weaver yea, motion carried with 4 yeas and 2 nays.

Harold Share was present and discussion followed on his request that something be done about the closed calvets under the railroad tracks.

Motion by Imler, seconded by Weaver to adjourn. All yeas, motion carried.
